RESPOND to the importance of having events at school where families participate in a shared experience. Review your school's calendar to find out when these occasions will take place, and consider how having a handmade invitation could make guests feel welcome and eager to participate in the events.







CONNECT the type of event with how you might creatively invite people. For example, if your school has a Family Night to which only parents/guardians are invited to meet the teachers, what images and words would convey that? If students join Student Progress Conferences to share their work and insights, what might that invitation look like and say? If your school's Welcome Back to School event is a family picnic with siblings and other relatives, how could your invitation show that?
